Councillor Graeme Coombes Graeme is the Wilshamstead Borough Councillor. Reporting to Wixams (July 2021)

There has been much discussion recently about the East West Rail (EWR) project and, locally, its impact on Wixams Station. You may recall, that at the initial consultation on EWR, there were five route options to consider, two of which went through Bedford Town Centre and three that took a southern route, broadly along the line of the A421.

At the time, the Mayor requested a meeting and asked me to support a route through the centre of town. He stated that a southern route might prejudice Wixams Station, either delaying it further, or turning it into a 'crossover' station, with EWR, and potentially outside of Wixams.

I took the Mayor at his word and supported the town centre option and welcomed the selection of route E when it was surprisingly chosen, despite being the most expensive option.

However, the Mayor has now run into a wall of opposition from those living near the chosen route and just before a special Council meeting to discuss the issue, he suddenly claimed that if an alternative southern route was chosen, houses in Wixams could be demolished.

Not only do I believe this is appalling scaremongering, without merit or justification, it begs the question why he never mentioned this previously? Under pressure, the Mayor's claim has been escalated from 'prejudicing' Wixams Station to 'house demolitions', and from potentially being outside Wixams to coming straight through Wixams. Which version are we meant to believe?

All of this makes me question if I should have originally taken the Mayor at his word.

We've been let down too often with our long delayed station. None of this helps Wixams residents and playing politics with the station, with false claims and unsubstantiated threats, is wholly unacceptable. We deserve better.

Wixams Parish Council News

New Benches

The nine new benches across Wixams are finally in. What may seem straightforward had many hidden complications, especially with such a wide variety of locations and (changing) landowners and sodden ground for months. Rock snake

Another project finished is the Rock Snake by Dane Lane lake. The parish council was pleased to support this project financially and thanks Amber for bringing this forward and for arranging the installation. To remind you, this project was to permanently embed the stones painted by children during lockdown on a raised plinth.

Waterside Way accessibility

The borough council have agreed to install a ramp on the steps between Waterside Way and Brooklands Avenue shops. A resident with accessibility issues pointed out that the steps were the only direct route to the shops, with the only alternative being a lengthy diversion.

Salt bin on Southern Cross

The borough council have agreed to place a salt bin

on Southern Cross where there is an incline between Village 1 and Village 2.

Green Lane parking issues

The parish council is requesting resolution from the borough council to the bottleneck created at the S-bend on Green Lane caused by a line of parked cars – this is a particular issue at school times. For those finding this a problem I would encourage you to write to borough council Highways requesting action; currently this is not being prioritised. (Highways. helpdesk@bedford.gov.uk)

Dane Lane lake path

You may be aware of the path deteriorating along the side of the lake by Dane Lane. The borough council are working with L&Q Estates to fix this and have requested feedback from the parish council. The proposal was for a gravel path, which we are resisting as it's an important route for schoolchildren and other users and needs to be protected from being saturated and flooded during heavy rain.

Planning

Bedford Borough Council Planning refused permission for a 5G phone mast for Wixams; the planning application showed a proposed location for the 18 metre mast on Bedford Road, quite close to houses. The borough council agreed with the parish council that this was not a suitable location – it is required to be away from houses and in a less visible position. However, the applicant has appealed to the government Planning Inspectorate and we await the outcome.

In the June meeting, the parish council chose not to object to the Reserved Matters planning application (the finer details of the development) for parcel 3.5 within Village 3. If you wish to see these plans then please visit the borough council planning portal and search for application 21/0440/MAR.

Crossing attendant

The borough council transport department carried out a study to determine if the criteria were met for a crossing attendant for the schools in Wixams, as supported by the parish council. The results were that Lakeview School did not meet the criteria, but the Green Lane schools do; however, their approach is to work on having a crossing installed. The parish council is not satisfied with this and has requested details of how to fund a crossing attendant.

Next Parish Council Meetings

Our next meetings will be on 19th July and 16th August at 7.30pm. Due to current Covid restrictions and availability issues for the large hall in Wixams, meetings will be held at Wilshamstead Village Hall in Wilstead for the time being. Please look at our website or agendas for confirmation

Councillor Tim Hill's Report

Tim is currently the Borough Councillor for Elstow, Stewartby, The Wixams Retirement Village and Kempston Hardwick

Bus Shelter outside Retirement Village - I am working with a range of people to try to get some funding for a bus shelter opposite the Retirement Village.

Residents Surveys - I have recently started doing physically distanced residents surveys in the Retirement Village. It has been great to get a very good response from the friendly residents. A big thanks to all the residents who returned their filled in surveys.

School Transportation - I am working with Greenlakes Rise residents whose children qualify for Free School Transport to Wixams Academy, but Borough Officers have so far refused to provide Free School Transport. It isn't safe for the pupils to walk to Marston Vale Middle and there is currently no pedestrian access to Wixams Academy!

Academy Parking - Residents have raised their concerns with me about the appalling parking at drop-off and pick-up time outside the Wixams Academy. They have asked me to try and find out when the area around the school will be adopted by the Borough Council. When it is adopted, it will make it easier for the Borough Council to work with the police on parking enforcement measures.

Street Advice Surgeries - I have re-started my Street Advice Surgeries, at 12.00pm-12.30pm one Saturday a month. These are advertised via social media, leaflets through letter boxes and by e-mail. I held one in the "Village Hall" of the Retirement Village on 22 May 21.

Central Bedfordshire Independent Councillor

In recent weeks after pressure from myself and Julia Archer, Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC) has launched the school transport for Wixams Village 4 children. Without the countless dedicated hours Julia spent researching the financial, social and environmental impact the delay this one pedestrian link was having on the residents of Wixams, and generating a Powerpoint to clearly demonstrate to CBC and Bedford Borough Council the timeline for this service would not have been this concise. Julia has been instrumental in gathering and collating information from affected residents enabling me the opportunity to successfully lobby the Council into providing this service for the benefit of Wixams children and their families.

Initially there were a few issues that were quickly addressed and, to the best of my knowledge, resolved. I am aware that there are a few applications still awaiting approval, but if you live in Village 4, are having to drive your children to school due to the footpath connection being delayed and haven't applied for school transport I would encourage you to do so; applications can also be made for children due to start school in September. I understand Councillor Tim Hill has also been working closely with Julia Archer to support Bedford Borough residents who have struggled to gain support from their Council for access to this transport provision. If you have submitted an application for school transport from Village 4 for your child and have either not had an outcome or been unsuccessful; I would encourage you to contact myself, or Councillor Tim Hill to follow up with the respective Councils on your behalf.

There have been concerns raised regarding the poor visibility at the Vision Blinds junction, which have increased after a recent accident; I am pleased to see that contractors have tended this location at my request for urgent action. I have requested similar response for Stewartby Way, Millbrook and How End Junctions; if there are other areas of concern that I have overlooked, please log the concerns on Fix My Street or email me at bex.hares@gmail.com with a description of the issue or a reference number for me to follow up with the Council on your behalf. I am currently lobbying the Council for repair to various sections of roads in our Ward, with the next major resurfacing repair at the Stewartby Way junction due to take place at the end of July; there are also drainage maintenance and pothole repairs on the schedule for the Summer months, again if there are any issues you notice on the road network that require attention please report on the Fix My Street app or website.

One final issue that routinely causes upset are those few dog owners not responsibly disposing of their dog fouling. I recently managed to get two bins installed specifically for the purpose of disposing of dog waste, the Council are currently unable to install more due to the roads being in private ownership. This can be discussed with the land owners if this is something residents wish to see, but until such time please dispose of dog waste in the designated bins, or until you return home.


Wixams Residents Survey 2021 - The Results!





2. How many people (including children) live in your household?




4. If you have a mobile phone from any of the providers below, how good is the mobile reception in your house?



5. How often do you use the bus services in Wixams?




6. How could the bus services be improved?




Residents commented that a Sunday/bank holiday bus service would be beneficial, as well as regular spacing between services and improved/more bus stops.


7. When built, will you use rail services from the Wixams station to commute (incl. to Bedford)?




8. Do you run a business from home?







12. How well do you know what is planned for the Wixams town centre?




13. Do you think the facilities in Wixams meet the needs of children & teenagers?



14. Do you feel like you're kept informed about the plans for the Wixams development?





15. Do you feel your views for the Wixams development are being taken into consideration by the developers and councils?




16. Should regular meetings/open sessions be held for residents to keep them informed of the plans for Wixams?








18. What are your top five issues in Wixams?

There are serious problems with parking on the pavement that makes people using a wheelchair or pushchair have to go onto the road in order to pass.

We desperately need green open spaces.

More provision for wildlife protection for swans, i.e. not throwing litter into lake

All new builds were mandated to provide bike racks yet there are no viable cycle routes in and around wixams without having to negotiate the A6.

The council also need to look at school places, we are promised brilliant schools as a selling point when moving here only to find the school places go to children from surrounding villages, priority should be given to Wixams children.

Not enough attention given to parking issues and safety of children as in school crossings etc

Developers are more interested in building houses instead of extending the schools to accommodate the amount of families moving in. Wixams looks great on paper but the reality is there is nothing here when you move in. No large outdoor green land, no GP surgery and even worse no public house!!

Leisure centre with a gym and swimming pool are sorely needed. This would also cut down on the number of young children swimming in the lakes which carries a high level of risk and, unfortunately, litter and antisocial behaviour.

Not enough facilities- school places, cafes, shops, pubs etc compared to other new build areas. Also Doctors was promised all I can see are warehouses being built

The sheer amount of lorries coming in and out of wixams is a concern. I think it's quite dangerous for children to play outside as the roads are narrow in Wixams generally

Please do something about the cars parking on side roads in Wixams especially up Green Lane. They make driving through impossible with the accident risk being very high because they limit our vision

> Train station was big factor in us moving here but I'm still waiting.

Lack of consultation with Wixams residents on planning issues.

Parking on Brooklands Avenue needs more control as it is often very dangerous and emergency vehicle access would be difficult.

Use of the 3G pitches need to be managed/policed better due to the amount of anti social behaviour and driving related incidents near by.

Now the industrial estate is being built by retirement centres which makes no sense, you need pedestrian crossing in place to make it safe.

The lack of access between the villages need to be resolved ASAP.

Need more footpaths by roads

We are great at providing facilities for the young kids, but the developers forgot children grow up and their is nothing for the teens. My son goes to Wilstead to use the basketball courts. Why can't there be things like that in our own village? L&Q/BBC must be made to listen to residents who have lots of good ideas


A fantastic place to live except for the appalling parking and rampant speeding. 20mph everywhere







Gardening Tips for June by Marion Colledge

Raised beds, containers, trugs, little space

A friend has a huge camelia in a large pot and a lot of the leaves were going yellow. It had been watered daily during the dry weather, so it wasn't that. Camelias need a lot of iron, and there is an iron supplement available. But I also suggested this plant would need taking out of the pot, and repotting and more compost added underneath. The roots were probably 'pot-bound', going round and round in circles at the bottom and climbing back up the sides.

We had an amazing three inches of rain the day I am writing. I went out in my raincoat and filled linseed oil tubs and buckets as the water butts were overflowing—rain water is precious stuff. It's always better to water with rain water than tap water, as the latter is mostly quite alkaline, and may contain traces of the chemicals used to purify it for drinking. If your downpipe is shared with a neighbour, maybe a

joint arrangement can be made to have a water butt? In the larger garden/on the allotment Weeds/Grass clippings

The grass on my allotment paths was suddenly two feet high and had to be cut. I can't use it for mulching, or for courgette beds because of the seed heads. It has to be composted. The compost must be damp enough and mixed inside all the other compost with a fork, or grass seeds may ripen and be still 'viable' when the compost is used.

My metre-wide nettle (urtica dioica) patch is now as tall as me, and I'm going to cut it below the flowers and make a compost juice in a dustbin. I don't count nettles as a weed. Ladybird larvae feed on them when tiny, then go to fruit trees/broad beans to eat around 200 nuisance aphids a day.

Favourite Spring/Summer Plants

You can now prune shrubs that flowered in the winter or spring, like viburnum fragrans, forsythia, choisya, early clematis, providing there are no birds nesting in them. Apple trees too that are giving out too many sappy branches after the rain can have some of the crowded ends broken off. It will make them less vulnerable to insect infestations such as apple saw fly or aphids and the tree will require less moisture if the weather becomes hot and dry.

Catmint, delphiniums and other tall flowers may need staking to hold them up in summer winds: three or four canes and two circles of green string will do it.

Roses and poppies and most other flowers can be deadheaded to make them flower more—you may not need secateurs, just do it with finger and thumb as you pass by.

Enjoy your garden! And if you have time, visit some local open gardens. The nearest are probably the Kathy Brown's Garden at Manor House at Stevington (Tuesdays and Bank Holidays, small charge, bookable) and Wrest Park (Nat. Heritage, booking required due to Covid).
