Wixams Surgery Action Group Update

A meeting of the Wixams Surgery Action Group was held on Monday 18 September. The purpose of the meeting was to elect a Chair and Committee and to gather thoughts from Residents on what our next steps in the quest for a Doctors Surgery should be. The meeting was attended Wixams Residents, Cllr Graeme Coombes – Borough Councillor for Wixams & Wilstead, Cllr Rebecca Hares – Central Beds Councillor, Emma Holland-Lindsay – Lib Dem Candidate for the new MP for Mid-Bedfordshire.

Actions agreed at the meeting were:

- Collate a list of questions for the next ICB Meeting and attend the meeting
- Gather information from local GP surgeries regarding oversubscribed waiting lists, waiting times
- Gather patient stories to highlight the problems encountered by the community to get to a surgery outside Wixams
- Find out what the criteria we have to meet to quality for a Doctors Surgery
- Once the new MP for Mid-Bedfordshire is in place take forward with them
- Present the petition to the ICB

Since the meeting on 18 September the Wixams Surgery Action Group has moved at pace and the following has happened:

Wixams Parish Council News

Street Racing along A6 and Anti-Social Behaviour

PC Lawson attended the PC meeting and advised the Parish Council that the police are aware of the street racing issue in Wixams and surrounding villages. They are doing all that they can to stop the speeding motorbikes and the arranged gatherings, which lead to street racing along the A6 at extremely dangerous and illegal speeds. He urged everyone in Wixams to continue to report any incidents that occur to 101. In the past, they have been able to use video footage taken by a resident to help in the conviction of one of the drivers.

Proposed extension of parking restrictions on Brooklands Avenue

The Parish Council voted in favour of implementing no verge parking for the entire length of Brooklands Avenue (Little Owl Lane to the roundabout at Bedford Road). This is not to include the side roads coming off Brooklands Avenue. The Parish Council has also requested double yellow lines at the junctions to the side roads coming off of Brooklands Avenue which prevents parking in line with the Highway code.

It was also decided a request for placing double yellow lines on both sides of the road for 10 yards at the junction of Southern Cross and Swift Way and the Junction of Southern Cross and Linnet Lane would be made.

Clerk reported that notification of a consultation period will be made by the Borough Council.

Bedford Borough Council Report

Borough Councillor Graeme Coombes reported the litter and grass along the verges on both sides of the A6 would be cleared by the Borough Council at some point in the near future. To safely do this one lane of the A6 will be closed while the team are working along the roadside.

Due to the delay in the Department for Transport approving the plans for Wixams train station there will be a delay in the proposed opening date of December 2024. This delay will likely see the train station not operational until December 2025 or later.

Planning

The following Planning Applications were discussed by the Council:

- Application No. 23/01972 single storey rear extension Council had no comments or objections to this application.
- Application No. 23/01616/M73 Variation of Condition Application Council voted to object to this application. Council does not agree with plans to remove 2/3 bedroom homes and replace these with 5 bedroom dwellings. The council would encourage the council to insist on a broad spectrum of homes to reflect the needs of Wixams growing community.
- Application No.23/01614/M73 Variation of Condition Application Council had no comments or objections to this
 application.
- Application No. 23/01950 Single storey rear Council had no comments or objections to this application.

Parish Council Logo

Councillor Whitely presented options for the Parish Council Logo and this logo was approved.

Wixams and Wilstead Underpass

Following an attack in the Wixams and Wilstead underpass Cllr Bowman discussed the possibility of implementing security measures for the underpass between Wixams and Wilstead. Clerk to speak with BBC street lighting team to

ensure adequate lighting is in place. Cllr Coombes has offered to put some of his ward funding towards a mobile cctv camera if this security approach was found to be a good deterrent for anti-social behaviour.

Community Garden

Bedford Borough Council has given approval for the land between the Village Hall and Lakeview School to be adopted by the community to create a community garden. BBC have also offered to help the Community Garden Group with clearing and planting the area. The first meeting of the Community Garden Group was held on 2 October 2023. Average Speed Cameras on the A6

The council discussed the possibility of requesting BBC to place Average Speed Cameras along the A6 to help prevent the high speeds at which people are travelling along this road. Mayor Tom Wootton was in attendance and suggested a meeting with himself, Deputy Mayor Jim Weir and officers from the BBC Highway team meet with parish council representatives to discuss solutions for combating the issue of speeding along the A6.

Christmas Tree and Lights for Village 2

The Parish Council discussed increasing the number of Christmas trees to ensure all villages within Wixams' growing community are included. Also to be discussed in a future meeting is the purchase and installation of decorative lights on the streetlamps.

October update from your Local Bedford Borough Councillors

This month we learned the disappointing news that the Borough Council's Planning Department has decided to approve the planning application for landscaping the area which is frequently referred to as 'the rookery'. Borough and Parish Councillors, as well as residents, had all expressed the view that what was proposed was too intense, and that the site should be left with a more natural feel.

In particular, the view was expressed that nothing should be done which potentially harmed the birdlife on the site. Although the applicant and the Borough Council have agreed to relocate the proposed outdoor gym equipment elsewhere, the rest of the application has been approved. Yet again, Bedford Council's Planning Department has chosen to completely ignore local opinion when making important planning decisions.

The Department for Transport has given the approval for Wixams Station to go ahead, subject to certain conditions. This is a further step along the way to getting the long-delayed station built. However, as the Department for Transport took nearly 14 months to give the approval, this has had a knock-on effect on the timetable for the station opening, and the previous date of December 2024 will have to be put back as a result.

Despite yet another delay, the Borough Council remains fully committed to the Wixams Station scheme. Environmental mitigation work has already taken place and planning permission for the project was received on 20th February 2023. Agreement has also been reached with National Rail for a 'hybrid' delivery strategy, where National Rail will be responsible for track alterations, signalling and overhead line and power work and Bedford Borough Council will be responsible for all other project work.

As your Councillors we will continue to monitor progress and ensure that Wixams residents are kept fully informed.

HALLOWEEN CAKE POPS

Preparation and cooking time

- Prep: 30 mins
- Cook: 5 mins plus chilling
- Easy
- Makes 10

These eerie eyeball chocolate cake pops will be a hit with kids at Halloween – they can help decorate them too

INGREDIENTS

- 100g/4oz madeira cake
- 100g chocolate sandwich cookies
- 100g bar milk chocolate, melted
- 200g bar white chocolate, melted
- few sugar-coated chocolate beans and icing pens, to decorate

You will also need

- 10 wooden skewers
- 1/2 small pumpkin or butternut squash, deseeded, to stand pops in

STEP 1

Break the Madeira cake and cookies into the bowl of a food processor, pour in the melted milk chocolate and whizz to combine.



STEP 2

Tip the mixture into a bowl, then use your hands to roll into about 10 walnut-sized balls. Chill for 2 hrs until really firm.

STEP 3

Push a skewer into each ball, then carefully spoon the white chocolate over the cake balls to completely cover. Stand the cake pops in the pumpkin, then press a chocolate bean onto the surface while wet. Chill again until the chocolate has set. Before serving, using the icing pens, add a pupil to each chocolate bean and wiggly red veins to the eyeballs.

Leads and Leashes


Remember to keep your dog on a lead when walking your dog in public areas around Wixams. This is not only a legal requirement but also crucial for your dog's and others' safety. Always have a suitable leash on hand, especially near roads, wildlife, or other dogs.

Be mindful of other dogs

If you're walking your dog and encounter another dog, be aware of how your dog reacts and be ready to intervene if necessary

Identification

Ensure your dog wears a collar with an ID tag displaying your contact details. This is essential in case your dog wanders off during your outdoor adventures.





Respect Wildlife

Wixams is home to diverse wildlife. While on your walks, be mindful of wildlife habitats, nesting areas, and grazing livestock. Keep a safe distance and prevent your dog from chasing or disturbing them.

Carry poop bags with you at all times and clean up after your dog. You face a Fixed Penalty Notice of up to £100 for failing to do so, and it's just common sense! "I didn't have a bag" is not an excuse.

Teach children about dog etiquette





YOUTH CORNER by Ellie

Hey!

Welcome back to the Youth Corner. Everyone has a sweet tooth, so why not bake some cakes?

Here's a cupcake recipe!

Prepare the following ingredients

- 110g softened butter
- 110g golden caster sugar
- 2 large eggs
- 1/2 tsp vanilla extract
- 110g self-raising flour
- For the buttercream
- 150g softened butter
- 300g icing sugar
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 3 tbsp milk

Heat the oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4 and fill a 12 cupcake tray with cases. Get a parent to do this!

Using an electric whisk beat 110g softened butter and 110g golden caster sugartogether until pale and fluffy then whisk in 2 large eggs, one at a time, scraping down the sides of the bowl after each addition.

Add 1/2 tsp vanilla extract, 110g self-raising flur and a pinch of salt, whisk until just combined then spoon the mixture into the cupcake cases.

Bake for 15 mins until golden brown and a skewer inserted into the middle of each cake comes out clean. Leave to cool completely on a wire rack.

To make the buttercream, whisk 150g

softened butter until super soft then add 300g icing sugar, 1 tsp vanilla extract and a pinch of salt. Whisk together until smooth (start off slowly to avoid an icing sugar cloud) then beat in 3 tbsp milk. Spoon or pipe onto the cupcakes.

Gardening Tips for October by Marion Colledge

arion, a dogged gardener in all weathers, is a member of RHS, and Biddenham Gardeners Association
The rain this summer has been welcome. I have been kept away from the garden due to visitors, but runner beans in a well composted raised bed have produced a good crop without being watered. I didn't need to mist-spray the red flowers in the evenings. I have had to hunt

out the snails in the ajuga in front of the bed though.

The weather has favoured them despite frogs in the garden. There are various ways of getting rid of them; small ones - squash between finger and thumb; large ones - poke a stick in them or crush and throw in nearest compost bin. Leaving them around will attract flies.

My kiwi trained on the south-facing brick wall was protected with a mulch of dry grass from the midsummer lawn cut and a kitchen waste compost bin to the side provided moisture and food, but on Saturday 9 September, half its leaves suddenly dried up. I should have misted those in the evenings. The fruit has not fallen off and will still ripen in November.

Small spaces - fruit trees

The other day a new allotmenter said to me 'Will the apples on that little tree get bigger when the tree gets bigger?' I said, 'No, the size of the apple depends on the genus. This apple tree isn't going to get any bigger because it was grown on dwarf root stock'.

I had watered every two weeks with six buckets of water, but could not get potassium sulphate - fruit food - for a while,

so the apples on two of my dwarf trees were not swelling despite a good clear space round the bole (base) clear of grass and weeds. If you have only a small space, you can get big crops from small trees. In 2019 I was advised by Blackmoor Nurseries that along my daughter's twelve foot fence I could plant four cordons (sloping tree with a single stem where you keep the side branches well-trimmed). I planted two, two-year old pear trees (Beth and Beurre) and two, two-year old apple trees with spread-out harvest dates. Unbelievably, this year she has had eighty eight apples from her Royal Gala. The Golden Delicious has produced too much lush growth, so we have bent the branches over to discourage the sap from going to the ends of the stems rather than cutting off and given it potassium sulphate, hoping for a larger crop next year.

Box Moth

There were two Box Moths in my house the other night (see picture). I like their symmetry, but it's their grubs that, in the spring will destroy any small box hedges you have, so get your pheromone protection by the beginning of March if you can afford it



Larger Gardens / Allotments

Lawns

'No Mow May' has continued for many people who have cut sections of their lawns cutting only every two-three months. Good for hoverflies and wild flowers. My granddaughter (aged four) likes the white yarrow which has sprouted up in the lawn as much as the planted cosmos in the flowerbeds. Time for one last cut and a good rake out (de-scarify).

Planting this month

Of course it's garlic and onion planting month. You would put them on slight ridges, preferably rotating after a non-root crop and after dusting the soil with bone meal. They will need bird deterrents during the winter.

You can still plant Chinese leaf lambs lettuce, mizuma in your raised beds and pots, (avoid slugs with a circle of copper tape below the pot - they won't cross it). We probably have another four-five weeks growing time before frosts.


