On 8 December 2023 the Wixams Surgery Action Group Chair, Barbara Matthews presented the Wixams Surgery Petition of over 2000 signatures to Felicity Cox Chief Executive of the ICB BLMK Board at their Board Meeting in Milton Keynes. The question we raised with the ICB prior to the meeting was:

"We know that Wixams as a whole meets the defined criteria for a GP Practice as supported by the evidence attached.

Can you please explain how the ICB will now deliver the Wixams GP practice, with support from BBC and CBC funding, and that the annual running costs will be funded by BLMK ICB?

Additionally can you assure us that work can start on constructing the practice building within the next 12 months, and it will open in January 2025?"

Youth Club – Feedback from Wixams Youth Club

The Youth Club which meets every Wednesday gave feedback on their attendance at the Youth Club and how they enjoyed the activities.

Proposed Reporting System for Reporting A6 cars

A resident of Wixams presented a proposal for the introduction of a new reporting system for reporting cars racing on the A6. The Council agreed to set up a working group to investigate how this would be put in place.

Transfer of Christmas Tree from Lakeview School to outside Wixams Tree

The Council agreed at the Meeting on 17 October 2023 to investigate the possibility of locating a Christmas Tree outside Wixams Tree School. After consultation with David Wilson and Barrett Homes they agreed to fund the cost of the new Tree Pit and the Christmas Tree. The new tree pit is now in place and the Christmas Tree will be transferred to the new pit.

Removal of two dead/dying trees in Bedford Road

The Bedford Borough Council Tree Officer has advised the Council that there are two dead/dying trees which will be removed from Bedford Road near the Bus Stop.

Planning

The following Planning Applications were discussed by the Council:

Application No. 23/02/02461/FUL Full Planning Application. Two Storey side extension and garage conversion. The Council objected to this proposal on the grounds that the extension would remove access to parking spaces and turning circle.

Grant Applications

A grant application had been received from the Early Childhood Partnership for £1258.45 for hall hire for one year (£960) and play equipment (£298.45). This application could not be considered at the meeting as all the supporting documents had not been received.

CCTV

The Parish Council agreed to review the current CCTV system and a working group will meet to provide proposals for discussion at a future meeting.

Revision of Council Committees

The Scheme of Delegation Working Group presented their proposals to the Council. It was agreed to accept the proposal put forward. Chairpersons were appointed for the four Committees.

Councillor Rebecca Hares Central Bedfordshire Independent Councillor

Budget consultation for Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC) began on 6 December 2023 and will run until 9 January 2024

Please take part and tell us where savings should be made.

The budget consultation began on 6 December 2023 which gives YOU the chance to decide where you think Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC) should spend money, and make savings. It's really important you take part!

We started our budget process with a deficit approaching £25million!

Two weeks ago Cllr John Baker (Executive Member for Finance) explained how the financial legacy of the previous council administration was a significant factor in the need for Council Tax to rise when the council sets a budget in February.

This deficit means the council has to generate cash, or cut costs. In reality, we have no choice but to do both. On Tuesday, Cllr Baker introduced the draft budget and set out an honest assessment of how difficult it will be for the council this coming year.

It won't take a maths genius to predict the need to raise Council Tax by 5% in February. However, it is also clear Council Tax alone won't be enough to protect vital services.

We have spent every waking moment of the last six months considering potential savings. These include:

• Only filling essential vacancies, with the Chief Executive getting the final say over all new hires.

• A reduction in building maintenance to that required for emergency and safety considerations

• Cutting borrowing, while interest rates remain high.

• Carrying out a review of senior management posts.

Replacing IT equipment less frequently.

• Cutting council heating, lighting and cleaning bills.

• No longer providing free food waste bags (saving £70,000/year), which get stuck in the machines used to sort rubbish.

All this effort has brought the deficit down massively.

But even with these measures and the use of an eye-watering £16.5m of council financial reserves, the gap between income and proposed spend still sits at £1.9million.

The penalty for not sorting out the budget is huge.

In the last week Nottingham City Council followed swiftly on the tails of Birmingham City Council in declaring itself effectively bankrupt. When this happens, the government takes control of the council and pretty much all nonstatutory services cease.

This means no children's centres, no libraries, no garden waste collection, only essential road repairs, and any bus services which don't cover costs (there are lots) would cease.

So how do we fill this £1.9m gap?

After discussion with council officers, they have suggested several areas...

1. Charging for garden waste collection

Most local authorities already do this on the basis that only those with gardens would benefit. For example, Huntingdonshire charge £50/year, South Cambs charge £45/year and North Herts charge £49/year. Charging a similar sum for garden waste collection would provide the council with an estimated extra £2million/year. Some might be worried about fly tipping but this has apparently not been an issue in other local authorities as a result of the introduction of a charge. You would still be allowed to take garden waste to the tip if a charge for kerbside garden waste collection was introduced.

2. Reducing bus subsidies

At the moment, our Council Tax subsidises bus companies to the tune of £1.2million per year. This permits services to run where otherwise the private sector would not cover its costs. Removing some of these subsidies would likely mean a reduction in services in some areas. Bus subsidies do need to be reviewed, with some routes now so uneconomical that the council spends over £370k on subsidies of more than £5 per passenger. One route has an average subsidy of £16/passenger.

3. Increased use of reserves.

The previous administration did not put up Council Tax, and didn't fund that freeze with savings, leaving us likely to need £16.5million of council reserves in the coming year.

The council has further reserves of around £30million, but once they're gone, the council would likely run out of cash. Whilst our budget plan does predict these reserves should be restored in the years to come, this is no guarantee.

Using more reserves carries a significant risk, especially if there is continued economic turbulence.

4. Something else - you suggest. We'll look into any ideas proposed

If you were thinking of suggesting, "No pay rises for council officers", though, this is not an option as for local authorities, pay is agreed at a national level. We can't get involved in this side of affairs.

It's vital we get as many people as possible to take part. The more people who engage, the greater the mandate!

You may believe councillors don't listen, but we're doing this because we want to hear your views.

Charlotte's World Scout Jamboree Journey

The 25th World Scout Jamboree was held from 1–12 August 2023 at Saemangeum, North Jeolla, South Korea, hosted by the Korean Scout Association using the theme of - "Draw Your Dream" About 45,000 participants from 158 countries attended.

Unit 17 of the UK Scouts Contingent Bedfordshire Bees consists of 36 young people and 4 leaders.



Chosen as one of the lucky 36 Bedfordshire participants, I had the absolute pleasure of attending the World Scout Jamboree in South Korea in August of this year. I was selected out of over 130 applicants from various Scout groups across Bedfordshire.

First of all, I'd like to introduce myself - my name is Charlotte and I am a local Explorer Scout who has attended and volunteered at various local Scout groups including 1st Wixams (volunteering within their Beaver section). I attended the 78th Bedford Scouts in Elstow since 2017 where I joined Cubs. I later volunteered there as a young leader and I currently attend Explorer Scouts.

I was a part of Unit 17 of the UK Scouts Contingent called the 'Bedfordshire Bees' which had 36 participants and 4 leaders who were selected as part of a rigorous application process to narrow down 130+ applicants to 100 to attend the selection camp which then led to a place in unit 17.

Once selected to attend the World Scout Jamboree every participant/leader and International Service team member needed to **fundraise £4000 each** – an absolutely mammoth task given the **cost-of-living crisis and other difficulties.**

I am very grateful to Rosie from the 78th Bedford Scouts for her persistent commitment and effort to fundraise. We attended several events all over the Bedford area including a few in Wixams. Thank you to everyone who offered their support by purchasing from our stall.

Unit 17 had 5 days prior to the Jamboree in Seoul where we were able to roam around the city and take in our new surroundings. We visited the DMZ, which is a great way to **learn more about the history**, and the current situation of separation between



North and South Korea and the impact it has had.

We visited the Gyeongbokgung Palace considered the **most beautiful**, and certainly one of the largest of the five palaces within Seoul. This was where we were able to dress in traditional Korean dress also known as Hanbok.

Whilst our overall experience in Korea was centred around Scouting and the Jamboree, it was also important to gain an insight into the culture. We had the opportunity to visit numerous gorgeous temples - some of which were hidden within Seoul.

A couple of members of unit 17 even designed their own unit badge that best reflected the unit and what we were doing which included both the UK and Korean flag and their national flower in addition to the honeycomb and bee motif.

After the 5 days in Seoul we travelled to the Jamboree site in Saemangeum. It was massive! To show you the size here is the campsite over Wixams!

Whilst at the site, we met many Scouts from around the world which was an excellent experience. I collected many neckerchiefs and badges from around the world and heard many different stories about their varying experiences within the movement.

The temperature was around 30c and sometimes even reached 40. The rapid measures of the UK contingent in addition





to immediate measures from IST on site (e.g. Regularly giving out ice cold water bottles, sachets and bottles of Pocari sweat (a popular electrolyte), ice lollies and regular air conditioned coaches we were able to find relief in), we were able to **manage, adapt and overcome** the challenging conditions.

We were swiftly transported back to Seoul where we continued our Jamboree journey despite this being a very different experience to what we expected. Regardless of the circumstances, we still had an **amazing time** exploring what Korea's bustling capital had to offer.

We were fortunate enough to watch a baseball game (Doosan Bears Vs Samsung Lions).

On Friday 11 August all 45,000 Scouts attending the World Scout Jamboree came back together for the closing ceremony in Seoul at the World Cup Stadium, which featured some of the biggest K-pop (Korean pop) bands in the world.



I would like to give my thanks to the Unit 17 leaders Nick Kealy, Greg Kilpin, Chris Dodds and Amy Clews. **Without their unwavering support and dedication we would not have reached our goal**.

None of this would have been possible without the crucial aid of the thousands of volunteers both locally and internationally. The international service team and contingent management and support team were essential to make this event happen. Volunteers can range from helping around the site such as giving out food, running activities and admin.

Preparation time: 45 mins Cooking time: 22 mins plus chilling and cooling Serves: 12

Ingredients

- 500g vegetarian mincemeat
- I orange, zested
- I Granny Smith apple, peeled, cored and grated
- 2 tbsp whole milk
- icing sugar, for dusting

For the pastry

- 375g plain flour, plus extra for dusting
- 11/2 tbsp icing sugar
- I tbsp ground ginger
- I¹/₂ tsp ground cinnamon
- ½ nutmeg, finely grated
- 225g cold unsalted butter, cut into cubes

Gingerbread Mince Pies

Not just your typical mince pie. Elevate them with these few simple additions.

STEP I

First, make the pastry. Tip the flour, icing sugar, spices and a pinch of salt into the bowl of a food processor. Add the butter and pulse until the mixture resembles breadcrumbs. Add cold water, I tbsp at a time, pulsing between each addition until the mixture starts to come together into a dough. Remove a third of the dough and shape it into a flat disc, then do the same with the larger piece of dough. Wrap and chill for 30 mins.

STEP 2

In a bowl, combine the mincemeat, orange zest and grated apple. Heat the oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6. Roll the larger pastry disc out on a lightly floured work surface to a 3-4mm thickness. Use a 10cm biscuit cutter to stamp out 12 circles, then use these to line the holes of a 12-hole muffin tin. Divide the mincemeat mixture between the pastry cases. Brush the pastry edges with the milk.

STEP 3

Roll the smaller piece of pastry out to the same thickness on a lightly floured work surface. Use an 8cm biscuit cutter to stamp out 12 more circles, then use these to top the mince pies, gently pressing around the edges to seal. Cut out Christmas shapes from any offcuts, if you like, and stick these to the tops

STEP 4

Bake for 18-22 mins until the pastry is golden. Remove from the tins and leave to cool on a wire rack. Dust with icing sugar to serve.





Gardening Tips for December by Marion Colledge



arion is a dogged gardener, a member of Garden Organic, the RHS and the plant swap website FB .Bedford Abundance.

Well, what a wet autumn it has been! Apart from no-mow May, some of us had no-mow autumn because there wasn't a dry enough day to cut the grass (mine is about 20 cm high). When my friends' rabbit came for holiday-sitting and was let out to graze in my walled garden, she flatly refused to get her paws wet in the grass. The sparrows were also tricked by mild weather and in mid-October raised a third brood of chicks under my front eave, feeding off whitefly caught on spiders' webs. Along with other plants the rosemary bush (rosemarinus officinalis) is flowering because the conditions till today (24 November) resembled those of spring. It has outgrown its space and although we use it with meats, I can't keep up with it and am trying to source other people's plates!

Pruning

Autumn and winter are traditionally a time for pruning bushes and trees. We pruned our forsythia down to the older wood that will flower next spring. The James Greave apple is again getting too big for the wall it is against. If you can shred your prunings, do so, they can be mixed into the wetter peelings in a compost bin and make a better mix and prevent wet mush forming. The woody parts of plants contain much needed carbon compounds. As I said to my Ukrainian house partner, 'Think of the cycle of transportation and processing costs, when we



send stuff away in a council bin and then go to a store to buy compost!' A small, controlled bonfire in a burner in a safe place is also useful. You'll produce enough ash to make slug and snail deterrent to put in little circles round tender plants. It's valuable, so keep it in a bucket somewhere dry.

Plants to grow now (including in containers)

Three suggestions - cyclamens are always around in large stores, but the odds are they have been 'forced' in heated greenhouses and won't survive to naturalise outside, so it is best to choose a reputable online supplier. Hellebores, we used to call the single white ones Christmas roses, will be pretty. The classic single ones are better bee-attractants than the more complex-petalled ones. Finally, if you want to save money on buying herbs for Christmas cooking, you could buy a low-growing rosemary (prostratus rosmarinus officinalis), creating ground cover



and preventing weeds at the same time. Needs full sun and should not be overwatered.

Protecting the Soil on larger plots

You can still plant some kinds of green manure seeds to stop unprotected soil being lashed and hardened by rain. If you have a moment to spare in your upcoming holidays and we are in a mild spell, you might try forage peas (the ones they usually feed to cattle). The peas will have pretty pink/mauve flowers and the tops are full of nitrogen. But later in February/ March you will have to decide – will you let the odd winter-flying bumblebee enjoy the flowers or will you dig in the tops to benefit the soil, which was your intention?

Christmas Presents How about winter-

flowering scented bushes for the future? There's a great article on winter-flowering shrubs at *https://www. rhs.org.uk/plants/* Think Christmas box small enough for a container, wych hazel, smaller white honeysuckles. I am asking my daughter for wintersweet chimonanthus praecox luteus with its bell-like flowers. I will let you know how I get on




